

■ Tall Tree Wind Farm

COMMUNITY INFORMATION SESSIONS SUMMARY REPORT

- AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER 2025





The Tall Tree Wind Farm is a proposed renewable energy project located in the Golden Plains Shire, West of Lethbridge, North of Teesdale and South of Meredith in Central West Victoria.

The project, which is situated in the Central Highlands Renewable Energy Zone (REZ), has the potential to generate enough energy to power up to 250,000 homes annually, with up to 53 wind turbines on site, and could create up to 270 jobs during peak construction, as well as 10-12 ongoing jobs during operations.

The project is currently in the environmental assessment and approvals phase, with referral documentation submitted to the Department of Transport and Planning on 6 June 2025 and currently awaiting a ministerial decision.


EVENTS SUMMARY

ACCIONA Energía hosted five face-to-face Community Information Sessions and one webinar during August and September 2025.

The event format replicated the November 2024 information sessions, which incorporated both a panel-style Q&A followed by a drop-in session – this format was developed in response to community feedback following the March 2024 drop-in sessions. ACCIONA held four panel-style sessions (one each in Meredith, Lethbridge, Shelford and Teesdale) and one drop-in only session (in Meredith). Panel sessions included a brief presentation from the project team, followed by a panel Q&A where community members could pose questions to the project team. The panel was followed by a brief drop-in format that allowed community members to have one-on-one or smaller group discussions with the project team if they wished to do so. The drop-in session featured a less formal format with no presentation. Rather, attendees could 'drop in' at any time during the two-hour window, peruse the project collateral and ask the project team questions.

Panel sessions were scheduled predominantly in the evenings, with one during the daytime and one at the weekend. These session timings were offered in response to feedback received from the community following the March and November 2024 Community Information Sessions.
